Acanthodactylus blanfordii **BOULENGER, 1918** Blanford's Fringe-toed Lizard

Global range: Afghanistan, India, Iran, Oman, Pakistan, and UAE.

Distribution in Iran: Provinces of Hormozgan, Kerman, and Sistan and Baluchestan.

Biology: Blanford's Fringe-toed Lizards occupy sand dunes covered with tamarisk and *Acacia*,



as well as areas covered with clay and gravel adjacent to sandy formations. This species has not been reported from elevations higher than 1,400 m a.s.l. When it feels threatened, it takes refuge in holes or root systems.

Size: Snout–vent length 66 mm, tail length 131 mm.

Reproduction: Oviparous.

Status: Common.

Conservation status: IUCN: -, CITES: -, National: Non-protected.

Diet: Arachnids and insects.

Activity pattern: Diurnal.
